



- Applicant Package -

About the Fund:

The NTWWA Scholarship Fund was created to help individuals and community groups further their education in the water and waste treatment field. There are two streams under which applicants can submit:

1. **Training Grant Award - \$1,500**

- ❖ Designed to encourage both mid-career individuals or youth planning to begin or continue their education training in the water and waste water treatment field.

2. **Campaign Grant Award - \$1,500**

- ❖ Designed to encourage Community Groups (Cadets, Guides, Youth Groups, School Classes, etc.) to run a community educational and/or environmental campaign on a water and/or waste topic.

A maximum of two (2) scholarships, \$1500 will be awarded annually.

Eligibility:

To apply, applicants MUST be:

- Canadian citizens or landed immigrants.
- Current residents of Nunavut or NWT.

Applicants under the age of 16 will require consent from parents or legal guardians.

Terms of Award:

The scholarship committee, whose decisions will be final, will inform scholarship winners of their award by October 31, 2017. Scholarship award monies will be delivered by cheque in two equal installments, as follows:

- ❖ **Training Grant Award:** The first installment will be issued upon receipt of 'Proof of Registration' in an approved course or program. The second installment will be issued upon Proof of Completion of the course/training.
- ❖ **Campaign Grant Award:** The first installment will be issued prior to the start of the Campaign. The second installment will be paid upon completion of the campaign.



Instructions to Applicants:

This application package is broken down into three parts (A, B & C).

PART A: Applicant Information

All applicants must fill out PART A and submit as part of the application either by email or by post mail.

PART B: Program/Course or Campaign Information

Applicants must respond to questions specific to their chosen scholarship stream. The applicant has the choice of submitting written answers to the questions, or creating a video response to these questions. Video submissions must not exceed eight (8) minutes in length. Acceptable file formats include .mpeg, .mp4 or YouTube link.

This is your chance to be creative. Perhaps you would like to show us your local water treatment plant and how you'd like to improve it? Maybe your community elders have said something that has inspired you to learn more about water and waste in the North. Tell us about it!

PART C: Documentation

All applicants must submit a letter of reference or letter of support. These can be obtained from a teacher, employer or community leader. Youth/Student groups applying for the Campaign Grant Award should submit a Letter of Reference or Support from the community leader or teacher overseeing the Campaign organization.

If selected for the award, Training Grant Applicants must provide "proof of registration" in their desired course of study within 6 months of being selected, and "proof of completion" of the course within 3 months of completing the course.

If selected for the award, Campaign Grant Applicants must provide a Campaign delivery timeline within 6 months of being selected, and evidence of completion of the Campaign within 3 months of completion.

Applications can be submitted in any official language of the NT & NU, however applicants are asked to provide accompanying English transcripts.
